

* Chola inscriptions on civic officials' eligibility

- Inscriptions at Thenneri, Kancheepuram on the walls of the Kanthaleeswarar temple.

- Chola-era inscriptions
- Talk about the qualifications required for members of the village admin council.
- Village admin committees known as 'perumkuri sabai'.
- It also sheds light on how farm produce was taxed.
- Inscriptions tells about 'Kudavolai' that is a system to elect members to the various Committees
 - The annual committee is known as 'variyaam'.

—The Kanthaleeswarar temple and the Abathgaeswarar temple are on the banks of Thenneri.

- Constructed by Sembian Mahadevi, the grandmother of Chola King Rajaraja.

— Thenneri:

- Perumpanatrupadai, a Sangam-era literary work, refers to the king who created the lake as 'Thondaiman Ilanthiraiyan'.
- The copper plates of the Pallava period refer to the lake as 'Thiraiyan Eri'.
- Over centuries, it has become Thenneri.
