- ↳ India-Africa relationship has a long history of partnership with solidarity and political affinity dated back to 1920s when both regions were fighting against colonial oppression.
 - This historical solidarity has today grown into a modern partnership.
- ↳ India's engagement with African continent has been multifaceted:
 - line of credit
 - capacity building initiative
 - co-operation in range of sectors like energy, technology etc.
- ↳ India-Africa agricultural co-operation:
 - India imports agriculture items like fruits, nuts, grains, pulses from African continent
 - Institutional and individual capacity-building initiative.
 - such as India-Africa Institute of Agriculture and Rural Development in Malawi
 - extension of soft loans and supply of machinery
 - acquisition of commercial farmlands
 - presence of Indian entrepreneurs in African agriculture ecosystem
 - active cooperation by subnational actor
 - such as Kerala govt proposals to create a brand of Africa-Kollam cashews.

↳ But India needs to further expand its relationship with Africa in agriculture sector. significance of such cooperation :-

- India should utilise unexplored potential of Africa in agriculture sector.
- It will help to achieve global food security
- Improvement in trade relations
- provide credible alternative to the increasing involvement of Chinese stakeholders in the sector

↳ Recommendation

- Incentivise Indian industries to tap into African agri-business value chain
- Indian technology firms and startups should start partnership with counterpart in African agri-tech sector
- Prioritize capacity building initiative in agri sector
- State govt and civil society organisations to identify opportunities and invest directly.

- India - Africa partnership
 - ↳ since 1920s, when both were fighting against colonial oppression.
 - ↳ India's support for decolonisation of African countries at UN.
 - ↳ Launch of ITEC (Indian Technical & Economic Cooperation) Prog in 1964 to provide technical assistance, aid for disaster relief, training, donation of equipments, etc
- Recent developments in India - Africa
 - Medicine & vaccine help during pandemic
 - PM's visit to Uganda in 2018.
 - ↳ released "guiding principles of Indian engagement in Africa".
 - Total Line of Credit ~ \$11 bn extended to 41 African countries (till 2020)
 - India - Africa Forum Summits (2008, 2011 & 2015)
 - ↳ enhanced engagements
 - 2018, GoI approved opening of 18 new Indian missions in Africa.

- Cumulative investments of US \$ 54 bn
 - ↳ India is 4th largest investor in Africa
 - Trade composition not changed much since 2000.
 - ↳ India is now Africa's 3rd largest trading partner.
 - ↳ India's top 5 markets are S. Africa, Nigeria, Egypt, Kenya & Togo.
 - ↳ India's exports are mainly mineral fuels & oils (processed petro products), pharma products & vehicles.
 - ↳ India's imports are mainly crude oil & pearls, precious & semi precious stones.
 - India's role in peacekeeping missions in Africa
 - Support to African counter-terrorism operations

- Recent cause of concern
 - Slowing trade & investments
 - Medical assistance declined
 - ↳ as India itself suffered from vaccine shortage
 - ↳ while China expanded its footprint by supplying more vaccines
 - Global Competition called 'The 3rd scramble'
 - ↳ in first 2 decades of 21st century

- ↳ Many countries from Americas, Europe & Asia assisting Africa to benefit from Africa's markets, minerals, hydrocarbons & Oceanic resources.
- ↳ Main competitors - US, EU, China & Japan.
- Attention to Africa lost out
 - ↳ due to geopolitical tensions in the Indo-Pacific
 - ↳ India's focus shifted to ties with UK, EU & the Quad powers.
- Way Forward
 - 4th India-Africa Forum Summit needs to be held asap, even if in a virtual format.
 - Fresh financial grants & concessional loans.
 - Industry engagements
 - Deepening collaboration in health, space & digital tech.
 - Cooperation among Intl. allies to counter China
 - ↳ Eg: recent India-EU summit identified Africa as a region for partnership based approach.
 - ↳ Quad summit in Washington should also propose a partnership plan for Africa.
